



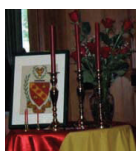

Since it was my first DKG convention, I was eager to compare it to the many other conventions and conferences I've attended – mostly literacy based types and math conferences. The women there were amazing! They were gracious, enthusiastic, and friendly. Unlike many of the other conventions that I've attended, this one had such a feeling of service to it. No one had anything to gain or to sell us, other than ideas to help students, teachers, adults and children who have suffered devastation (ie: Katrina), and ways to advance chapter goals and service projects. What a wonderful organization!

Some of the highlights were:

- General Session I – Celebrating Chi State Women in the Arts. Members of the many chapters in California were featured via PowerPoint pictures, a snippet about each artist read by Judy Kearns, and some actual performances by some of the musicians. It was so inspiring that we both agreed that our chapter should feature our talented members for one of our programs. Roseann's jewelry and Barbara's paintings were featured from Zeta Zeta. They were both STARS, and I would love for our chapter to see their work as well as the talent of many others in our chapter.

- Learning Is For Everyone (LIFE) Foundation Grant Awards where the Pay It Forward project was awarded \$500. Next year I would like to see our chapter get involved so the grant could be written from our entire chapter, not an individual.

- Saturday's Eving Gala: We were delighted by the outstanding and professional jazz music from the Deja Vu Middle School in Santa Clara. They have entertained and delighted listeners all over the world and received a standing ovation from members of Chi State.

- Interest Sessions on Saturday were also very informative. Roseann gave one on building a web site with standing room only. Many others asked her for the CD she put together outlining step-by-step "how to build a chapter website". Our dear president and computer guru was and is astounding. She definitely impressed me! I attended an Interest Session on Leadership and saw a wonderful video called *The Art of Possibilities* and another Interest Session on ideas to Spice Up Your Chapter Membership.
