A note from Jeanne Gelwicks:

Dear Zeta Zeta Friends,

Kit called me last night to check on Carol/ Carmen's report that I was unwell. After hearing what I had to say, Kit wanted to include a follow-up bulletin, which I said I'd be glad to write.

My symptoms in early April were unexplained weight loss, loss of appetite, and fatigue. After multiple Kaiser doctors' visits/ tests, exploratory surgery was ordered in mid-July. Shocking new diagnosis: Stage 4 liver/bile duct cancer accompanied by minimal success with chemo/radiation treatments. Following surgery, I have been blessed with daily caregiving, no pain, nutritional guidance, and most recently, the arrival of my Kaiser Hospice team. I feel most energetic in the a.m. until mid-afternoon when a good nap and quiet evening seem to work best.

I was sorry not to be with you on the 29th, but I do plan to attend the Area III Conference on October 18 with my daughter, Elizabeth. I look forward to saying hello then, but in the meantime, if anyone so chooses, what works well for me are e-mails/notes with funny/meaningful notes, or short phone calls.

Zeta Zeta members gave me a warm welcome when I transferred from Omicron in 2003. I have so enjoyed participating in DKG experiences with quite a few of you and celebrate our camaraderie and sense of purpose.
