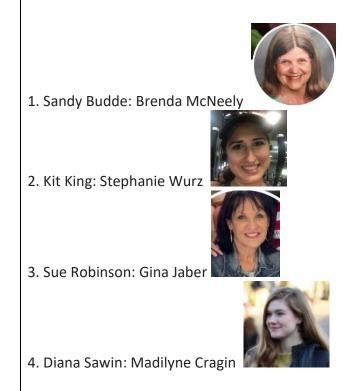

Update on Efforts to Repeal Unfair Social Security Provisions (HR 82) by Karen Yee

 The Social Security Fairness debate is alive and well in the House of Representatives! A Sub-Committee Hearing for bill HR 82 was held on November 20th in 'Baton Rouge' Louisiana, led by Ways & Means Committee Chairman Jason Smith (MO) and Social Security Sub-Committee Chairman Drew Ferguson (GA)

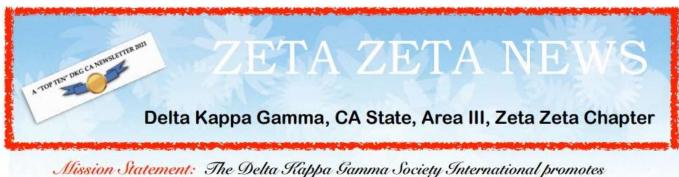


- HR 82 author, Rep Garret Graves (LA), in conjunction with CalRTA leadership and the <u>Social</u> <u>Security Fairness National Coalition</u>, a 100-member effort, helped influence Ways & Means Committee Chair, Jason Smith (MO) to hold a Hearing on this bipartisan bill to eliminate penalties and provide long overdue fairness to public servants.
- The Hearing was focused on the negative impact the S.S. Windfall Elimination and Government Pension Offset provisions on public employees and their families in 15 states.
- Some Public Sector worker witnesses were personally invited to speak at the Hearing, and written comments were submitted as evidence by CalRTA members explaining how these penalties have negatively affected their retirement security.

- HR 82 has the 3rd most cosponsors of any piece of proposed legislation in Congress right now
 ... and that is because there is ample bipartisan agreement that the WEP & GPO are unfair to
 public employees and their spouses.
- The conclusion was ... Congress must find a bi-partisan way to provide public servants with the full retirement they are entitled to ... that was the "goal" of the witness who testified.

Many thanks to members who are responding to weekly CalRTA Legislative Alerts! Your actions have helped move SS Fairness bill HR 82 over the threshold of 300 cosponsors in The House ... which prompted the first Hearing for Social Security Fairness in over 10 years!

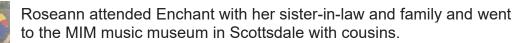
Karen Yee just returned from France taking a Viking cruise from Paris to Moen and back. then three extra days in Paris.
