Let's have a large group participate. It will be fun to see all the chapters represented in California.




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## ZETA ZETA - WHAT'S HAPPENING?


**Christina Clemens** got her mermaid tail wet again by doing some diving in Monterey. She is getting Kelp Restoration certified to help the Monterey Bay!!

#### **UC Outreach by Roseann Krane**

Expanded outreach at 65 community colleges with lowincome students is being planned by the University of California in an effort to increase the number of students who successfully transfer from those colleges. They hope to increase transfer access and attainment.

The need to do more to recruit community college students is especially key now because of a massive drop in enrollment at community colleges. Since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, the colleges have lost about 18% of their enrollment. Subsequently, applications to UC from community college transfers declined by 11% for fall 2022.

UC campuses plan to spend \$2.5 million set aside for the system's <u>Student Academic Preparation and Educational Partnerships</u>, according to the item presented to the regents. They feel UC campuses must have a presence at rural colleges, and not just at their transfer fairs. He said that could include in-person visits from UC representatives, but also virtual events.

#### Governor's 2023-24 Proposed Budget by Karen Yee

Education funding remains high with a total ADA funding of \$17,519 per pupil and an overall total education funding of \$23,723 per pupil. That includes a cost-of-living increase of 8.13 incorporated into the local control funding formula. This proposed budget does not factor in any kind of mild recession due to our slowing economy, however it suggests cuts between \$20-40 billion are likely for the May Revision, after the April tax receipts are reflected.

Implementation of universal Transitional Kindergarten is on target for completion in 2025-26, expanding access to all children turning five-years-old between Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> and Feb 2<sup>nd</sup>. This includes \$337 million for certificated or classified staff in those classrooms. This also significantly alters the "active to retired teacher ratio" for the State Teacher's Retirement System (CalSTRS).

This proposed budget continues to fund \$3.9 billion for the state's contribution to CalSTRS, an approx. \$218 million increase from 2022!
