#### **Diana Sawin:**

On January 16, 2025 DKG Zeta Zeta members celebrated at our in person meeting at the Brass Door Restaurant catching up on "What's Happening" in the lives of our fellow sisters. **Cindy Luengo** provided a fun Ice Breaker while guest presenter **Joanette Sorkin** was assisted by **Courtney Fischer** providing technical support prior to the program on Autism and Neurodiversity.

**Karen Yee** and **Sandy Budde** introduced Dr. Joanette Sorkin sharing background information on her extensive professional career as a psychiatrist with over 25 year's experience in the medical field. Her presentation was amazing as she shared further information on Dyslexia and Universal Design. Most interesting we learned about classroom adaptations that would support students in the general education environment. Joanette also tied some of her topics with examples of her 11 year old son's behavior through the years.

Thank you **Nancy Myers** for your handout with a detailed Budget / Actuals for 2023/24 and 2024/25. See Zeta Zeta Chapter Budget info on page 3 & 4. **Karen Yee** presented the updated SSA Fairness Act, WEP/GPO which repealed two federal laws that affected the retirement income of nearly 3 million public employees: teachers, classified school employees, firefighters, law enforcement officers and others who have earned Social Security benefits that have been reduced or even eliminated because they also receive a government pension." This will make a difference in the lives of so many – today's educators and future educators, not just retirees." **Kathleen McCreery,** *former chair of ACSA'S Retirement Committee*.

Next month **Christina Clemens**, Area III Coordinator will share her attendance notes from the Winter Leadership Planning Session, WLPS and give us information about the DKG CA Convention taking place in Los Angeles.
