Monument Crisis Center

As you read in the Co-President's letter, Zeta Zeta chapter is supporting many projects, programs, and organizations. One of them is the **Monument Crisis Center** (located in Concord) which serves low-income families and individuals in Contra Costa County by providing nutritious food, education, general assistance and referrals. Over the last year, with the help of hundreds of volunteers and donors, Monument Crisis Center distributed a five day supply of food to over 14,500 individuals, thereby providing one million meals to those most at risk in Contra Costa County.

In addition to food service programs, Monument Crisis Center advocates for at-risk families and individuals and strives to unite the community in a forward effort to alleviate poverty. They want to provide backpacks to children who are going to school without any supplies.

Zeta Zeta Chapter hopes to provide backpacks that are full of supplies so that these children can be successful students. Several of you may form teams so that supplying one or more stuffed backpacks can be practically and economically possible. Below is a letter from the head of the Backpack Committee, **Carly Owens**.

Dear DKG Members,

We are collecting backpacks **and** supplies again this year. We are partnering with **Monument Crisis Center**. The flyers list the supplies needed on the next two pages. There is one for K- 5 and one for Middle School and High School. You can drop off your donations at Carly's house. **The drive goes from June 23 to July 23**. If possible pack the backpack with all the supplies on the list. However, there is a **QR** code on the attached flier if you'd prefer to donate directly to the Monument Crisis Center.


If you would like to help us fill the backpacks with the supplies let us know. The more the merrier.





- Prop. 98 for schools and community colleges will be \$4.3 billion less in 2025-26.
- Preventing cuts to TK-12 will require draining the rainy-day fund and deferring paying \$1.8 billion next year.
- Districts will find the 2.3% COLA amid declining enrollment difficult to manage.
- UC and CSU had expected an 8% cut instead of the 3% it will get.
