#### **Gail Faber & Don Phelps of Todos Santos Trading Post**

Topic: California Indians: Gail shared her \$10 book, Pasquala, regarding the California Indians. About 400 kids go through the Museum of the San Ramon Valley to participate in the historic program. Don Phelps showed his mortar and pestle dug up near Pittsburg 50 – 60 years ago. The larger ones used to be left behind but the smaller one would be carried along at the tribe traveled. There have been approximately 57 bone fragments uncovered at San Ramon Valley High School during the construction of the new gym. A picture from between 1915 – 1920 was displayed showing California Indian women under an oak tree with their baskets. After sharing information regarding his transition from the corporate world to the world of education, Don discussed his current role at St. Mary's focusing on Native American Studies and Ethnic Studies for the Native Americans. There will be a show of articles made by the 3<sup>rd</sup> Mesa at the Alamo Women's Club, May 20 – May 22, supporting the craftsmanship of the different Indian Nations. Don was able to share his extensive knowledge of the different tribes of California and details of their lives. The group enjoyed his presentation.
