**DUES INCREASE:** After a lengthy discussion and vote of the delegates, Delta Kappa Gamma Society International raised their portion of our dues \$20, which makes our total dues **\$85.00**. The main reasons are these: rising costs, maintaining the vitality of our Society, taking care of immediate needs of our members, and building a reserve fund for emergencies (like Katrina).
