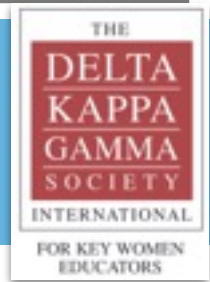

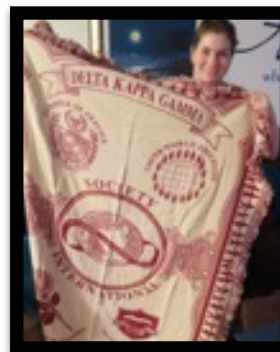

In Memory of... **A**lice Reynolds

Our dear friend and fellow educator, **Alice Reynolds**, passed away last week at the age of 94. She joined our chapter in November of 1970 and served as treasurer for three years, produced the directory, and was involved with membership and scholarship for many years. She will be remembered as an outstanding educator who graduated Magna Cum Laude from Brown University, and did biological research at University of Pennsylvania. She began her teaching career in a nursing school where she taught anatomy and chemistry. From there she taught in New York, and then came to this area and taught in the San Ramon Valley. Alice was selected twice as Teacher of the Year in the San Ramon Valley Unified School District - once when she taught at Rancho Romero Elementary and the second time as teacher at Greenbrook Elementary. In fact, your editor's younger son was in her class at Greenbrook. Matthew remembers her fondly as someone who was not only a great teacher, but was very kind and sweet to her students.



Alice earned a teaching credential from S. F. State College (now University) and her librarian credential for the Univ. of S.F. She was a Girl Scout leader, taught classes on California Indians at the Museum of the SR Valley, was a docent there for ten years, and was one of the founders of the Old Tassajara One-Room School House. She "taught" third graders who visited there for ten years. We all loved her and will dearly miss her.

LEGISLATION UPDATE**Patt Low****ACSA's Sponsored Bill, AB 2336 (Olsen), on Substitute Teachers in Special Education Advances to Senate**

With a 79-0 vote on May 5, 2016, the Assembly unanimously approved the ACSA-sponsored bill, AB 2336 by Assembly Member Kristin Olsen. The proposal will extend the number of days a substitute teacher may serve in a special education classroom. If passed by both houses and signed by Governor Jerry Brown, AB 2336 would increase the number of days that a special education substitute teacher is able to

serve in one classroom to 40. Current law restricts the number of days to 20. The bill specifies that a substitute teacher must be provided with six hours of training prior to the service extension, as well as ongoing support by a fully

credentialed teacher.

The intent of the bill is to provide a stable learning environment to special education students, while also supporting substitute teachers who step up to support them while full-time teachers are away from the classroom. The bill currently has a five year sunset and is considered a short term strategy while the state simultaneously considers other legislative proposals aimed at addressing the teacher shortage and pipeline issues from recruitment to credentialing, induction and retention.

The bill was heard in the Senate Education Committee on June 8th and amended to include a provision for approval of an extension of 20 days to be added to current 20 days. For the full text of the bill and its amendments, please visit the [California Legislative website](#).

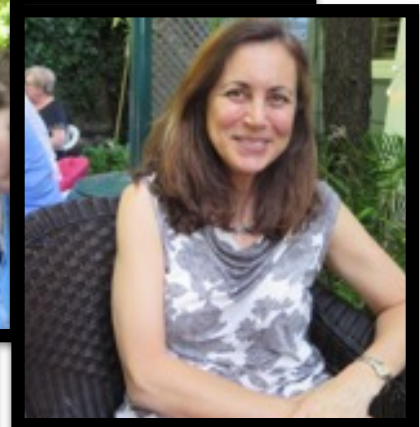
